Important Information for Registration

*PK/K camps: These half-day camps run 9:00 – 11:30 a.m. or 12:30 – 3:00 p.m. Optional BYO lunch/recess is available if registered for both morning and afternoon. Pre-camp only for morning session. Post-camp only for afternoon session.

Age/Grade: The child's age on the first day of camp; the grade they enter in Fall 2024. Age trumps grade.

Preschoolers must be at least 4 by the first day of camp.

Campers must be able to take care of their own toilet needs.

ACNC accommodates some special needs. Call the Camp Director to discuss.

Cost: Prices vary based on materials and travel; most camps are \$210 and members receive a 25% discount. Prices are inside.

CIT/JC: Teens may assist with camps. Counselors-in-Training (CITs) are ages 13 – 15. Junior Counselors (JCs) are ages 16 – 18. Details inside.

Drop-off and Pick-up: You may drop off campers at 8:45 a.m., no earlier, and must pick them up by 3:15 p.m. unless attending Pre-/Post-Camp. Details inside.

Requirements at Time of Registration

There is a \$25 deposit per child, per session. The balance is due a week before camp. Camp t-shirts are optional with registrations before June 1. Deposits and t-shirt fees are non-refundable.

Discounts

Family Memberships (\$60) and higher get 25% off each session and may register starting January 1. You may purchase, renew, or upgrade memberships at registration.

Refund Policy

If you cancel more than two weeks before camp, ACNC will refund everything except the membership, deposit, and t-shirt fees. There are no refunds for cancellations made less than two weeks before camp starts.

Free Exploration Camps

Free Exploration Camps are nature-play-based and partly driven by the campers' interests. Adults are present to supervise and teach. Research shows that unstructured play, especially outdoors, is a key developmental component missing from the lives of many children. Time is divided roughly between 70% nature play and 30% structured time.

These camps include extra features, supplies, take-home kits, field trips, or specialty topics. Travel is to both NY and PA locations and may vary with weather.

Nature Craft Camp (Grades 1 – 4, Ages 6 – 9)

July 9 – 12, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. \$225 (Cost includes art materials)

Using mud, berries, and other natural materials, campers can draw inspiration from nature to build, paint, and create art, some to take home and some to leave behind.

The Wild Kitchen (Grades 5 - 6, Ages 10 - 11)

July 16 – 19, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. \$225 (Cost includes supplies)

All the food we eat as humans comes from nature. Campers will taste, prep, and eat plants from both ACNC's kitchen garden as well as some common wild edibles.

Survival Camp (Grades 5 – 6, Ages 10 – 11)

July 23 – 26, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. \$240 (Cost includes a survival kit)

Campers head out into the woods and fields to learn basic survival skills including building fires and emergency shelters, how to signal for help, and purifying water. A survival kit is included in the cost of this camp.

Animals Camp (Grades 6 - 8, Ages 11 - 13)

July 30 – August 2, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. \$240 (Cost includes travel and admission)

Campers will learn about different groups of animals, wild and domestic, and trace their journey and connections to people. Campers will take a field trip to a zoo, farm, fishery, or other animal care facility to learn more about the relationships between humans and animals.

Teen Treks (Grades 7 – 9, Ages 12 – 14)

July 23 – 26, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. \$240 (Cost includes travel and admission)

Campers explore and discover some of the natural treasures of the region through hiking, climbing, and adventuring. Details on exact destinations and activities are determined the week of camp based on weather.

Backpacking Camp

Intro to Backpacking (Grades 7 – 9, Ages 12 – 14)

August 6 - 9, 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.** \$240 (Cost includes materials)

Campers will learn the basics of backpacking, including how to set up camp, prepare meals, stay safe, and become more comfortable and confident in the woods. This camp includes an optional overnight** at Audubon. Some supplies will be provided. A supply list will be provided prior to camp.

Deep and Sticky Learning Camps

Children have a deep curiosity about the world. Providing opportunities for them to wonder, deduce, and conclude through personal experience is the ideal learning environment. These camps are more structured, using themed topics and lessons to engage campers. Time is roughly divided between 70% learning and 30% nature play.

Mini Naturalists A (Grades PK – K, Ages 4 – 5)

Morning: July $2 - 5^*$, 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. (T, W, F only) Afternoon: July $2 - 5^*$, 12:30 - 3:00 p.m. (T, W, F only) \$75 (*only three days, not July 4)

Fueled by their curiosity about the world around them, campers use tools such as magnifying glasses, collecting jars, binoculars, and traps They will document their discoveries through pictures and words.

Patterns of Nature (Grades PK – K, Ages 4 – 5)

Morning: July 9 - 12, 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. Afternoon: July 9 – 12, 12:30 – 3:00 p.m.

Campers will get creative and discover the patterns and cycles found in nature through games, exploration, and art.

Mini Naturalists B (Grades PK - K, Ages 4 - 5)

Morning: August 6 - 9. 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. Afternoon: August 6 – 9. 12:30 – 3:00 p.m.

Animals Need Plants (Grades 1 – 2, Ages 6 – 7)

June 25 – 28, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Healthy habitats have hundreds of interactions between plants and animals. Through exploration and experiments campers will discover ways that animals use plants to survive and learn that plants need animals too.

Creature Connections (Grades 1 – 2, Ages 6 – 7)

July 16 – 19, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Why do plants need soil, and what do omnivores eat? Campers will explore interactions of living and non-living things in their habitat, and learn how they are connected in a large web of life.

Who's Been Here? (Grades 1 - 2, Ages 6 - 7)

July 30 – August 2, 9:00 a .m. – 3:00 p.m.

What made that hole? Whose tracks are those? Campers will collect clues, search for tracks, investigate bones and skulls, and hypothesize what animals have been there.

Building Blocks of Nature (Grades 3 – 4, Ages 8 – 9) June 25 – 28, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Campers explore the natural world from the bottom up and the inside out as they search for living things, the habitats they engineer, and the resources they use to survive.

From Pond the Forest (Grades 3 – 4, Ages 8 – 9) August 6 - 9, 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Ponds, forest, and fields, oh my! Campers compare and examine animal and plant habitats using tools.

Wild for Wildlife (Grades 3 – 5, Ages 8 – 10)

July 30 - August 2, 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Campers learn about the different types of animals and explore some up close. Guest speakers will bring live animals and campers will catch and release others.

Natural Interactions (Grades 5 – 6, Ages 10 – 11) June 25 – 28, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

The natural community is always at work. Living things constantly interact with each other and their surroundings to create and shape the natural world. Learn about the natural interactions that occur every day, all around us.

Pre- and Post-Camp

Pre-Camp: \$18 for the week or \$5 per diem Drop-off is no earlier than 7:45 a.m.

Post-Camp: \$36 for the week or \$10 per diem Post-camp runs until 4:30 p.m.

Members receive 25% off weekly fees. No discount per diem. No Post-Camp on morning half-day camps. No Pre-Camp on afternoon half-day camps.

Counselor-In-Training (CIT) and Junior Counselor (JC)

CITs and JCs are teenagers who want to gain volunteer experience. ACNC trains all CITs and new JCs. Interested teens should fill out an online application.

CITs are 13 - 15, work with younger camps, and must attend a training. Trainings are three hours and are held certain Saturdays and Mondays (dates TBD). ACNC encourages a week of observation during the first week of camp.

JCs are 16+ who have been a CIT or JC previously and attend a review session or

attend a full training session. JCs help with all age groups except the oldest. Contact the Camp Director, Sarah Hatfield, with questions.
