

Happy Trails

Terry LeBaron, Buildings and Grounds Manager

If you've been out hiking the trails at Audubon Community Nature Center over the last ten years and thought 'wow, these trails are incredibly well maintained and clearly marked' – you have enjoyed the hard work and dedication of Terry LeBaron.

Terry focused his time and effort on creating a safe and accessible experience for the more than 1,500 people who visit Audubon's trails each month. In addition to maintaining trails, Terry has also overseen a variety of projects including the installation of new interpretive signs, building fences in the Wildlife Walk and green play areas, updating the aviaries, repairing and rebuilding trail structures and bridges, monitoring and repairing the property's more than 50 nest boxes for breeding birds, and more.

Most importantly, Terry has been the fearless leader of one of Audubon's greatest assets – the Building and Grounds volunteer team. This motley crew of men and women volunteer their time and talents to

keep Audubon's buildings and grounds open and safe to the public seven days a week, year-round. This group, who adopted the name of 'OWLS' has been lovingly self-described as: 'Old, Weak, Lame, and Senile'. However, it is time to re-brand the OWLS to a more accurate description which includes: 'Outstanding, Wise, Loyal, and Sassy'.


These individuals, fueled by coffee and sugar, keep Audubon open to the public day after day, from clearing trails, to shoveling sidewalks, to building trail structures and bridges.

Welcome Bridgette!

ACNC welcomed a new addition to its Animal Ambassadors in mid-September. A second Red-tailed Hawk now occupies the front aviary of the Pamela A. Westrom Wildlife Habitat building. This hawk has also been deemed non-releasable by Tamarack Wildlife Rehabilitation Center.

Bridgette hatched in 2023. She was found as a juvenile in Western PA with an injury to her right wing. Fortunately, there were no broken bones, but scar tissue formed which prevented her from being able to fully extend her wing. Bridgette is able to fly, but it takes more effort and energy for her than an uninjured hawk, making it potentially difficult for her to survive in the wild. She is a curious and feisty bird, and we are excited to add her to ACNC's Animal Ambassador team!





Education

School Programs

Between October 2023 and September 2024, Audubon's one seasonal and three year-round Nature Educators delivered a total of **1,013 school programs** which included in-person classroom and schoolyard visits as well as field trips to the Nature Center. Audubon's school programs are carefully curated to enhance classroom curriculum through the introduction of hands-on learning opportunities that feature both real and manufactured natural artifacts.

ACNC engages with an incredibly diverse audience through its partnership with local schools and organizations. Children who may face barriers to spending time in nature or are not able to visit Audubon Community Nature Center get to experience nature up-close in their own classrooms. As we see more diversification within communities due to the increase in refugees and immigrants, ACNC educators will be working to understand the barriers (transportation, lack of local knowledge, language) that might prevent children from being able to develop real and healthy connections to nature.

Day Camp

The 2024 summer day camp season was a great success! Over the eight weeks, Audubon hosted **490 campers** who participated in **47 Camps**.



Festivals and Events

In addition to school programs and Day Camp, Audubon Community Nature Center hosts a variety of other programs and events throughout the year including escape rooms, birthday parties, and annual events such as the Enchanted Forest.

Annual events, birthday parties, and escape rooms bring in additional income that support the organization's mission. These programs and events are also designed to reach a broader audience beyond Audubon's regular membership.

Audubon Lights, held in late March to early April, has become one of Audubon's brightest attractions. More than **1,200 people attended** the 2024 event over the course of six days.

Audubon also hosted a Solar Eclipse event which included approximately **250 people from 12 different states, and two foreign countries**. People gathered together to experience this once-in-alifetime natural event that took place right in the Nature Center's backyard.





Volunteers

Between October 1, 2023 and September 30, 2024, **198 volunteers contributed 7,044 hours of service.** Of those volunteers, 25 are a part of the Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP).

ACNC's volunteer program stands out. Many individuals commit to a lifetime of service including 100 to 11,000 hours. Each year, ACNC has to say 'goodbye' to volunteers who have either retired or passed on.

This year was no exception. We said farewell and thank you to three incredible individuals: Denny Anderson, Larry Brown, and Leah Bullock.



Denny Anderson

Denny volunteered in a variety of capacities over his many years of service including birdseed delivery, nest box kit building, general carpentry, roadside clean-up, and more. Denny passed away in late September, just after purchasing his annual birdseed order and visiting with his Audubon family. His incredible dedication to ACNC and his kind (and sometimes affectionately snarky) comments will be missed tremendously.



Larry Brown

Larry dedicated much of his life to Audubon Community Nature Center. In fact, Larry volunteered a total of 11,423.25 hours – the most recorded volunteer hours in ACNC's history. Larry was incredibly passionate about protecting and encouraging ACNC's forests. He spent countless hours wrapping saplings with tree tubes to protect them from deer browse, transplanting unique tree species into locations where they would thrive, and preserving and improving the Ted Grisez Arboretum.

Larry recently moved to Rochester to be closer to his daughter. We will miss seeing his smiling face and his three-wheeled buggy out and about on the trails.



Leah Bullock

Leah volunteered at Audubon for more than 30 years. She served as chair of the mailing committee for many of those years, making sure that the bi-monthly newsletter was properly folded, taped, and labeled before it was sent to more than 1,500 households. She and her husband also provided essential support for the annual Snowflake Festival event, and she was an excellent gift shop assistant to Pat Spicer, former Blue Heron Gift Shop Manager. Leah passed away in mid-October. Thank you, Leah. We will miss you.



Summary of Volunteer Lifetime Service Hours

Audubon's volunteers are the organization's most treasured resource. Since 2007, more than 800 individuals have contributed 155,419 hours of service. Before that, volunteer hours were not yet recorded, but they certainly still counted!


Financial Sustainability


Audubon is unique in that no more than 20% of its total operating income comes from any one source. **Program and admission income represents the highest percentage of total operating income.** ACNC recognizes that for a non-profit to maintain financial sustainability, it must have a diverse income stream.

In 2023 – 2024, Audubon took its 5% annual distribution of \$90,221 from its endowment. These funds are used to help cover operational and capital expenditures each year, and to ensure steady cash flow throughout the year.

71% of Audubon's annual expenses include staff salaries and benefits. Over the past four years, Audubon has worked to adjust its salary ranges based on increased job responsibilities and the increase of New York State's minimum wage.


